Universal Training Descriptions

Teaming and Relationship Building

Increased knowledge and skills in collaborating, communicating, and problem solving will be just some of the outcomes from attending this regional training. Teams will also learn about why and how to use organizational tools to enhance their productivity and efficiency as a team. Throughout the day participants will have opportunities to hear how school teams in their region are implementing teaming strategies as well as share their own success stories and do problem solving. The teams will have valuable time to work together.

Effective Instructional Practices

This training will increase participants knowledge regarding current research about best practices in education at the universal level of implementation. Proactive instructional practices that enhance all learners' responsiveness to instruction will be discussed focusing on how implementation of these instructional practices becomes school-wide. Throughout the day participants will have the opportunity to network with school teams in their region and share their own success stories. Teams will leave prepared to implement practices, coach school staff, and assess the integrity of implementation of instructional practices that enhance learning for *all* students.

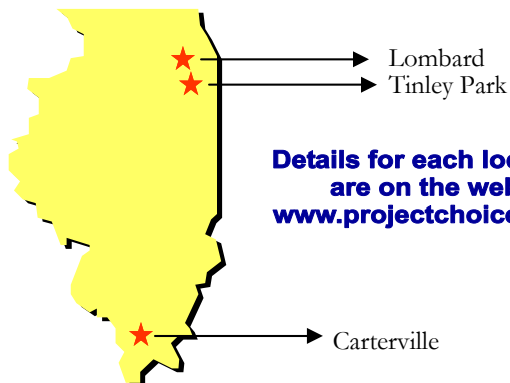
Adaptations & Support Systems

This training will provide participants with information about how adaptations increase opportunities for all students, including those with disabilities, to access the general education curriculum in inclusive classrooms. Participants will learn both universal and secondary/targeted processes for adapting the curriculum using the 8 types of adaptations so that teachers can reach all learners. The differences between accommodations and modifications (types of adaptations) will be clarified. Teams will learn many tools and strategies to adapt curriculum that can be implemented immediately. Adaptations are critical because not all students learn in the same way or at the same rate. Participants will have time to plan for sharing essential information about adapting with the educators in their buildings.

School, Family & Community Partnerships

How do schools, families and community members effectively collaborate on the educational and social outcomes for all students? Research supports that a collaborative team is pivotal to educational outcomes for students, families and educators. Participants will leave with a richer understanding of the barriers that exist for school staff, family members and community participants as we attempt to work together for improving outcomes for all students. Time will be spent examining and reflecting upon the Parent Involvement Policy and how our schools invite families and community members to support, evaluate and share this policy. Schools are encouraged to bring families and community members to this training.
